1. Please list the key current assets:

- LBCC Partnership w/Linn=dental clinic (children)=model(Rita's extend to Benton?)
- BGCC dental clinic
- Oral Health Coalition
- Community Health Department (Adult mental health, public health, WICC, environ health, health center (4 clinic sites, health depart, Lincoln, Lebanon, Monroe)
- SHS-Central Admin (3 counties) good comm. partner; SLCGH residency, School
- Community Outreach
- Mental health provides: COL, PCC, CFH (residential name skills), OR Family Spt Network, Nami, Janus House, Old Mill, Oxford House (2)

- Communication links between services
- Information/referral information
- Support networks for lifestyle changes (info on): weight loss, etc.
- Dollars/funding
- Detox: place/support to reach "5 day clean" period (Buckly, Eugene; Bridgeway, Salem, Hooper, PDX; Truman, Newport
- Use of local media (methods) for public svc announcements, event coverage; cohesion (specifically radio)
- Transportation to/from outlying areas
- Physical space
- Education to providers (coordination) & consumers about what services exist and how to access

3. Please list your ideas about where to go from here:

- Investigate extending LBCC dental screening clinic model to Benton
- Kids Care Fair (registration, info) stations (hearing, dental, vision, inoculation) record created, education (resources, etc.)
- Attention to the coordination (better) of resources—create a continuum of care fair, link to health care home. Can do a better job serving (enhance capacity)
- LBCC collaboration for college credits (i.e., Milestones program)
- Investigate=what do media outlets use to get/give info
- Training on how to take medical history (med students/homeless) laminated
- Reframing the conversation: “What does it take to put you out of business?”
- Convening stakeholders (provides, ins): service access, delivery i.e. Lane’s 100% access coalition

- Interested community members coming to the table—highly educated & creative
- University research/needs assessment

- Agricultural eden—loss of production processing and storage facilities, certifying kitchens
- Info gap related to statistics
- Affordable housing—low-income; homeless, MH& addictions
- Case management & follow-up services, income to get into permanent-living situations, detox facility (regional), transportation (R), services for Latino families/cultural competencies, childcare, appropriate political jurisdictions (transportation), education to providers (coordination) & consumers about what services exist and how to access
- Benton County growing fast 17%

- Delivery of food needed-vehicles
- Emergency shelter—addition, mental illness, untreated mental illness
- SPD—those who don't qualify for Medicaid
- Need general assistance while applying for disability
